VANCOUVER, B.C.: The Pacific National Exhibition (PNE) is asking for the public's help in tracking down a stuffed toy that was a popular prize at Playland Amusement Park.

The PNE is offering to exchange any Playland prize of any size for one of the pigs (in good condition). The pig is pink, approximately eight inches long, has beanbag stuffed feet and a white tuft of hair on his head.

"We are confident that there are a large number of pigs exactly like the one Oliver lost in households throughout British Columbia, and we are hoping people take the time to look through their children's stuffed animals and take this opportunity to help a very heroic little boy," says PNE President and CEO Michael McDaniel. The PNE will also offer the first person willing to exchange the pig a set of family tickets to Playland.
