2. Introductions/Housekeeping

- Introductions of Whitney Law, new Community Relations Manager and Shelley Frost, new President/CEO
- John Brodie, Project Manager PNE Master Plan is committed to attending some meetings re: any new developments

3. Topics to Discuss

3.1 Fair Move Out/Park Restoration

- Fair overall did well, strong second week, great feedback
- Some Neighbours continue to be concerned with unsafe parking issues surrounding Hastings Park
 during Fair. Concerns raised are twofold: 1 Safety for individuals walking in traffic soliciting
 parking sales. 2 Current bylaws should prevent this activity. Q who enforces this activity
- PNE maximizes parking onsite during Fair to help mitigate parking from neighbourhood to a PNE lot
- Continue to push need for additional parking in the PNE Master Plan (currently contemplated to utilize the centre infield of the racetrack)
- Restoration of Fair back to park starts day after labour day
 - Portable buildings now off-site
 - o Greenspace needs time to recover, has been reseeded
 - o Amphitheatre currently still set up for last concert there of the season

- Two weekends of Playland after Fair, CircusWest back in Garden Auditorium and E. Livestock Building set up for film/sets/play
- Large compound at Lot 9B due to lack of storage/space onsite (to house containers, gaming merchandise)

3.2 Ongoing Noise Mitigation

- Amphitheatre redevelopment looking at new technologies
- PNE continues to have staff out doing sound readings at 10-15 different spots every 15-30 min.
 during an event
- Sound bylaw does not stipulate that there be no sound, it stipulates the level of sound that cannot be exceeded
- O Bylaw 6555 says No person shall in an activity zone or an event zone make, cause or permit to be made or caused, continuous sound the sound level of which during the daytime exceeds a rating of 70 on an approved sound meter when received at a point of reception for more than 3 minutes within any 15 minute window.
- Readings are directly communicated to Event Manager during an event, and Event Manager works with band to lower sound levels where needed
- PNE recognizes 2 recent concerts were challenging re: noise levels, and on one occasion with inappropriate language, and are taking steps to not have this happen again
- Confirmed each show has their own noise technicians/speaker systems
- Weather affects noise level/travel
- Discussion around possible physical, as well as new technology, sound buffers at Amphitheatre (i.e. baffles)
- Time limit has helped with noise most curfew is 10pm
- Sound has gotten better west of park; problematic at Dundas east of park
- Confirm neighbours can call 311 for complaints; emails are forwarded to Community Relations
- Neighbours can also call PNE's Community Engagement department at 604-251-7708 with any concerns
- Call Community Relations directly to express any concerns
- Amphitheatre redevelopment slated to start 2021

3.3 Basketball Courts

- NBA has inducted a famous basketball star to Hall of Fame and gifted an upgrade to a local community court
- Hastings Park basketball court chosen (located beside Gate 2 on Renfrew)
- There will be an announcement during a special basketball game at Rogers Arena on the 29th
- Design will conisist of one (1) outdoor/open space court at Italian Gardens

3.4 Expanded Community Skate Program

- Program runs last Sunday of each month until February 2019
- No rental option for skates/helmets
- PNE has purchased skate aids
- No concession; exploring vending machines
- Group ideas
 - Set different skate times for different levels (i.e. Teen skate night)
 - Community sponsorships (i.e. Tim Hortons)
 - o Family rate pricing; would be ideal to align to City family rate pricing
