

ICONIC SHOWS AND EXCITING NEW PROGRAMMING COME TOGETHER FOR STRONG 2023 PNE FAIR

B.C.'s largest ticketed event continued its century-long tradition of creating memories for hundreds of thousands with world-class attractions, entertainment and food

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Vancouver, B.C.: British Columbia's most beloved and well-attended ticketed tradition came to a close Monday evening as the 113th year of the PNE Fair wrapped up after 15 days of creating memories with 626,531 guests who attended from August 19th to September 4th.

"The combination of new attractions, the Summer Night Concerts lineup and traditional favourites really resonated with our guests this year," says PNE President and CEO Shelley Frost. "Overall, the 2023 Fair was a tremendous success. We want to thank the hundreds of thousands of guests who continue to make the PNE Fair part of their summer, our vendors and partners, all of the performers and our staff team for making this year so special," says CEO Shelley Frost. "The attendance was strong and feedback was exceptional. Now we look forward to giving away the PNE Prize Home next Monday and bringing over a million guests to our site for fall and winter events, including Fright Nights and the PNE Winter Fair!"

2023 Fair Attendance Tops 626,000

In total, the 2023 Fair remains British Columbia's largest ticketed event, with this year's attendance of 626,531, almost 100,000 guests above the 2022 event! (2022 Fair attendance: 529,772, 2021 Fair attendance: 239,000)

As always, this year's Fair included something for everyone. New and returning programming included the **SuperDogs**, the **Marketplace Building**, **Festival Park** and its diverse community programming, the **ToonCity Stage** with its family-friendly programming, the high-energy **Revel District**, the **agricultural programming** and **Livestock Barns**, and the very popular **Canoe Cultures** exhibit celebrating indigenous arts and culture.

PNE SAYS 'GOODBYE' TO HISTORIC OUTDOOR AMPHITHEATRE

When the 2023 PNE Fair closed on Labour Day, so too did the PNE Amphitheatre. The last show, **Blue Rodeo: 30 Years in July**, closed out the Amphitheatre's amazing 59-year run.

Other highlights of the 2023 **Summer Night Concerts** included **Billy Idol, Pat Benatar** and **Neil Giraldo, Jason Derulo, Aqua, Billy Talent, and TLC.**

The existing Amphitheatre will be demolished in the coming months, making way for a spectacular new world-class outdoor venue. The new Amphitheatre, which has been in the planning stages for several years, is anticipated to be one of the most impressive venues of its kind in North America when completed in 2026.

Designed to showcase British Columbia building products and engineering while adhering to the highest standards of environmental sustainability, the venue will be used to host a wide variety of music and culture events – ranging from our incredibly popular Summer Night Concerts at the PNE Fair, to arts and culture performances by symphonies, cultural innovators, community organizations and others.

PNE PRIZE HOME TO BE DRAWN SEPTEMBER 11TH

This year's Grand Prize is a luxurious fully furnished Craftsman dream home in Langley with Hygge-inspired interior accents built by **Lanstone Homes** in collaboration with **Wesmont Homes**.

The 2023 PNE Prize Home is 3,773 sq ft of lavish living space spanning with a Scandinavian aesthetic. Designed by **Brown & Co** and furnished by **Yaletown Interiors**, it offers five bedrooms and 5.5 bathrooms, a modern kitchen with **Fisher & Paykel** appliances, a rec room and a listening lounge. The home also includes a one bedroom, one-bathroom legal basement suite. **The total value of the PNE Grand Prize Package is \$2.3 million**.

The PNE is a non-profit organization. The revenue raised through the Prize Home Lottery supports a variety of non-revenue producing programs spanning agriculture, community, arts and a large number of other local programs.
